

ABSTRACT

Normally every human being can speak--communicate with others--though they are not able to read or write. It seems that the oral communication is more needed and considered more valuable than the written one.

Since language is primarily spoken, drilling is very important for children (students) because drill is as the basic of oral practice. Therefore, to develop children's the teachers speaking English ability, can use such as drills techniques, dialogue drill, picture drill, etc. However, drills can be boring if used for long, and they are based on the same element of practice (repetition), which is the justification for drills. As a result, childreen are discouraged to practice the spoken language. In other words, they have no motivation their speaking skill and feel bored practice facing monotonuous situation. Of course, here, the variation of drill techniques is needed to avoid drill to be boring.

As a matter of fact, the teacher should be creative to drill her students in speaking subject. In this study the writer chooses a technique through puppetry drill. Using puppetry drill in teaching speaking English here, the teacher uses puppets as an audio visual aid to drill children. There is never a shortage of material in using the puppetry drill. The various kinds of material can avoid puppetry drill to be boring.

Through puppetry drill, the teachers not only avoid drill that is boring, but also to develop ability in speaking.
