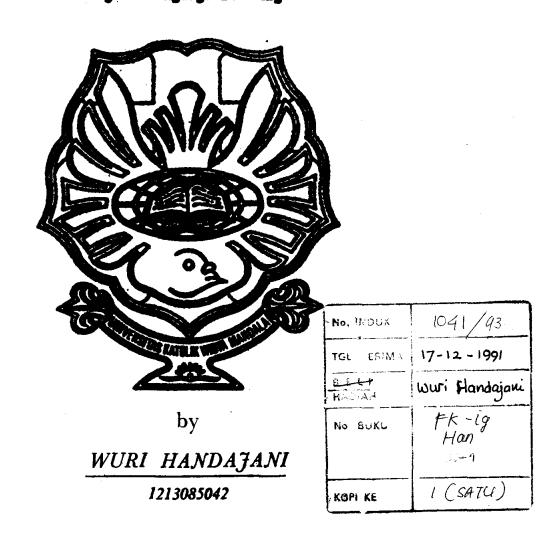

ABSTRACT

Among the four skills in English: reading, speaking, listening and writing, many students consider writing as an uninteresting subject because some exercises found in Senior High School students' reference book 'are not interesting and do not trigger the students' creativity to make a composition.

Attempting to overcome those problems, the writer tries to conduct a "new" technique. The writer is interested in a technique conveyed by Alexander which is presented in his book entitled "Practice and Progress". Here, he uses a set of questions dealing with a short paragraph. Those questions are planned properly so that it helps the students make a short paragraph that may have the same idea with the passage they have read.

The questions that will be presented here are a set of well-planned questions dealing with various kinds of materials, such as: a reading passage, a dialogue, a series of pictures and an advertisement.
